Clean drinking water provided for 680 families in Farah





The Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD) constructed and handed over a solar-powered water supply network in "Dar Abad Bala" village in center of Farah province. This water supply network cost 10 million AFN, which were funded by USAID/ UNICEF. With the completion of this project, around 680 families got access to clean drinking water. The project included digging of one 80-meter deep well, construction of one 100-cubic meter water reservoir, setting up of 20-kilo meter pipe network and installation of solar panels, 580 meter boxes and taps.

Clean drinking water provided for 450 families in Nazyan district

With the total outlay of 4,043,000 AFN that were funded by Ministry of Finance (MoF) through the State budget, a solar-powered water supply network has been recently completed in "Naway Niaz Mohmmad" village in Nazyan district of Nangarhar province. water supply network, which provides clean drinking water for around 450 families after completion was implented



through the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD). It is worth mentioning that the construction affairs of this project, created as many as 120 working days for the local residents.

A solar-powered water supply network handed over in Mirzaka district

Through construction of a solar-powered water supply network, the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD) provided drinking water for 200 families in Andwam village in Mirzaka district of Paktia province. This drinking water supply network cost 17 million AFN that were funded by USAID/UNICEF.

The project included digging of one deep well, setting up of a 3,000-meter long network, construction of one water reservoir and installation of 29 solar panels, a pump and taps. The project was executed by "Rag Andwam" Community Development Council in five months.



A solar-powered water supply network handed over in Kunar province

With the total outlay of 4.9 million Afghanis, funded by USAID/UNICEF, a solar-powered water supply network has been recently completed and handed over in "Soyer Dag" village in Asmar district of Kunar province. This drinking water network consists of a 2,800-meter long pipe network, a 30-cubic meter water reservoir and 23 taps.



With the accomplishment of this network, over 300 families got access to clean drinking water. Its working affairs created as many as 120 working days. The project was executed by "Soyer Dag" Community Development Council (CDC) through the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD).



Clean drinking water provided for 170 families in Kot district

The Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD) constructed a solar-powered water supply network in "Koz Bara Khail" village in Kot district of Nangarhar province, which provided clean drinking water for around 170 families.

The totally outlay of this project was 3,074,000 AFN of which 90 percent was funded by USAID/UNICEF while the remaining 10 percent of it was contributed by the community. The construction affairs of this project created as many as 120 working days for the local people.



Clean drinking water provided for 270 families in Hajji Aryub district



With the construction and handover of a solar-powered water supply network in "Koza Khair Mena" village in Hajji Aryub district of Paktia province, around 370 families got access to clean drinking water. The project cost 28 million AFN which were funded by USAID/UNICEF.

The project included digging of a 60-meter deep well, setting up of a 6,000-meter long pipes network, construction of one water reservoir, and installation of 36 solar panels and 50 taps. It was executed by "Koza Khair Mena" Community Development Council (CDC) through the Rural Water Supply and Sanitation (Ru-WatSP) program of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD).



Clean drinking water provided for 660 families in Kot district



The Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program (Ru-WatSP) of Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD) constructed and handed over three solar-powered water supply networks in Koz Hendrani, Haider Khail and Wacha Ghara villages in Kot district of eastern Nangarhar province.

The total outlay of these three water supply networks was 7,626,000 AFN of which 90 percent was funded by Ministry of Finance (MoF) through the State budget and 10 percent of it was contributed by the communities. These projects were executed by the related Community Development Councils (CDCs), and their construction affairs created as many as 340 working days for the local residents.
